We held 2 series of workshops across Te Hiku - Wā o Nehe(May) and Wā o Naianei(July) to look at the Past and Present education system, the deliberate acts and unconscious bias, the resistance and reclamation and the opportunities to plan for a better future.

On November 3rd, we will share our findings, and offer a safe, supportive space to whakawhitiwhiti kōrero/discuss the future for education in Te Hiku with our community.

This hui will feed into education planning for Te Hiku, that we hope will help shift the hearts and minds and educational outcomes for many years to come.
